



Northern Territory Driver Profile Checklist

What photos you need to upload:

Your car: front, back and side view

Why? We need to check your car is the one registered and insured, and that it is in good condition. Your car must also be **less than nine years old**. Please upload a photo of the front of your car first.

The front of your drivers licence with 'h' endorsement

Why? We need to check you are the insured driver, and that you are endorsed to drive your vehicle for hire.

How? Find out more about the application process in this [NT Government bulletin](#), Once you have all your documents, you can [apply for the 'h' endorsement online](#).

The back of your drivers licence (with current home address if changed)

Why? This is also for verification purposes.

Your vehicle registration

Why? So that we can verify that your car is registered to be on the road.

A roadworthy inspection that is less than 12 months old

Why? This tells us whether your car is safe enough to be picking up the most precious cargo – our passengers!

Current rideshare insurance for the car you'll be driving

Why? Not all car insurance covers rideshare drivers. As part of the application process you are required to notify your insurance provider that you will be using your vehicle for rideshare and ensure that you and your passengers will be adequately covered in the event of accident or injury.

A Commercial Passenger Vehicle Identity Card (CPVID)

Why? A CPVID from the NT Government is required to drive for rideshare.

How? If your application for the 'h' endorsement is successful you will receive a CPVID with it. If you are adding ridesharing to a current 'h' endorsement, you can find info on obtaining your CPVID [here](#).

A Commercial Vehicle Licence (CVL)

Why? The vehicle you use for Shebah must be registered for rideshare with the NT Government. NT law also requires rideshare vehicles to be **less than nine years old**.

How? Fill out and submit [this form](#), and pay both the licence fee and increased MAC insurance.

A working with children clearance

Why? The WWCC assures us and our passengers that we can trust you to transport children and keep them out of harm while you drive.
